Dear parents and carers

Welcome to the first newsletter of the academic year. I would like to begin this newsletter by thanking the staff, the students, and you, our wider community, for your support in making this half term so successful. Our new Year 7 students are settling into life at Limpsfield Grange well and we have enjoyed getting to know them over recent weeks.

At the end of the summer term, we bid farewell to our Year 11s. The Year 11s achieved some fantastic GCSE, BTEC and Functional Skills results, which reflected their hard work and dedication. I am pleased to report that our ex-Year 11 students have made successful transitions to colleges and sixth forms to continue their studies. We wish them well and hope that they stay in touch.

This half term students have participated in a range of activities. We invited Narrative Alchemy to school to perform *Unacceptable*, a performance which examines sexism, sexual harassment and sexual violence; an area of continued concern in schools across the UK. Students from years 8-11 watched the play and themes and topics from the play were addressed as part of our WACI curriculum. Year 7 students participated in a Royal Navy STEM Day, during which they worked really well together to solve puzzles and find solutions to challenges. Earlier this term students from our Year 11 Health and Social Care BTEC group visited a local care home for elderly residents. It was a very successful visit; students learned how the residents interacted with each other and how the care home met their needs. Both residents and students enjoyed chatting to each other.

On 5th November 2025 parents and carers have the opportunity to attend an online safety presentation from Childnet. The session aims to offer parents and carers help, advice, resources and guidance to support their child's online safety and digital wellbeing. The presentation will cover topics such as grooming, bullying, fake news and sexting. The session is open to all parents and carers of Limpsfield Grange students.
