



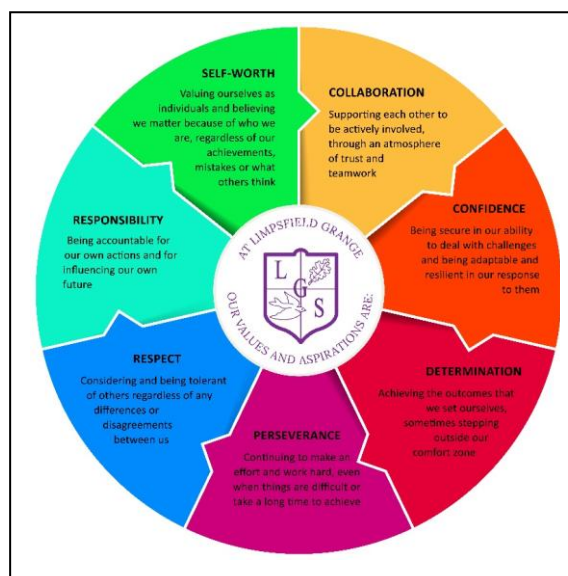
Newsletter March 2026

As ever, it's been a busy half term at Limpsfield Grange. Students in Years 10 and 11 watched excellent productions of Macbeth and An Inspector Calls, performed by the Globe Players. Both were fantastic productions and gave students an opportunity to see the play's characters up close. Students in all year groups took part in Stembotics workshops run by Hyett Education. Students worked in teams to design and build a LEGO robot to solve an engineering challenge linked to real-world problems. The activity enabled students to develop their design and engineering skills as well as team work, collaboration and expressive language skills.

Year 8 students visited the Buddhapadipa temple, a Thai Buddhist temple in Wimbledon. Students learned about Buddhist philosophy and practice and also enjoyed the beautiful ornamentation in the temple and grounds.
